Introduction: The ultimate goal of human life is to attain 'Unity with the Creator'. According to Swami Vivekananda 'God resides in every human heart'. So that, the best worship of God is service to mankind. Vivekananda emphasized on Man making education by which we can made a good citizen for our national development. According to Swamiji 'Man making means a harmonious development of the body, mind and soul'. It is the transmission of values such as : truthfulness, inflexibility, fortitude, kindness, dignity, attentiveness and other virtues. According to him, knowledge is inherent in man, not acquired from external sources. Indeed, education for life was the objective in the ancient Indian system through "Guru kula". Education is training for the completeness of life. Student had to convince the teacher of his desire, determination and the required intelligence to pursue purpose studies and undergo rigorous tests before he was taken as a student. Students were supposed to live in complete celibacy and in a very austere environment. Objectives of education were to develop his personality, his innate and latent capabilities. Swami Vivekananda was basically a spiritual master. So definitely he looked every change through the eye of spirituality. He has said, "All healthy social changes are manifestations of the spiritual forces working within and if these are strong and well adjusted, society will arrange itself accordingly". Moral values are the standards of good and evil, right or wrong which govern an individual's behavior and choices. Morality speaks of a system of behavior in regards to standards of right or wrong. Education for life should lay the foundation of goodness from the beginning of one's life. The role model student should not adopt ego-centered individuality, but replace it by ethic-centered altruistic personality. Though science and technology has given enormous power to the students, they are incapable of coping with consequences because personality has not grown commensurately with the developmental demands. In such a situation, life becomes bitter. It is felt that a value system that is integral to India's ethos with deep roots in the Vedas and the Upanishads can still be a shelter for preserving and enhancing the quality of life. According to Swami Vivekananda, character is the

For developing moral values and good character among our students, value based education should be included in our school curriculum. Swami Vivekananda emphasized on Man making education. "There is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of woman is improved. It is not possible for a bird to fly on only one wing" "Educate your women first and leave them to themselves: then they will tell you what reforms are necessary for them" "Our right of interference is limited entirely to giving education. Women must be put in a position to solve their own problems in their own way. No one can or ought to do this for them. And our Indian women are capable of doing it as any in the world"

Everyone has the right to education. Education shall be free, at least in the elementary and fundamental stages. Elementary education shall be compulsory. Technical and Professional education shall be made generally available and higher education shall be equally accessible to all on the basis of merit. This Right is also repeated in the UN Declaration of the Right of the Child which seeks to ensure. Right to Free and Compulsory Education at least in the elementary stages and education to promote general culture, abilities, judgment and sense of responsibility to become a useful member of society and opportunity to recreation and play to attain the same purpose as of education.

After independence of India in 1947, the University Education Commission was created to recommend suggestions to improve the quality of education. However, their report spoke against female education, referring to it as: "Women's present education is entirely irrelevant to the life they have to lead. It is not only a waste but often a definite disability." education acquired special significance and has been supported by the government from time to time through its policies and programmes. Therefore, in recent years the education system has expanded rapidly. But still a large number of women are in
