Introduction to the NSS Seven-Day Winter Camp (21st – 27th January 2025)

As part of our yearly tradition, the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of our college, in collaboration with Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, successfully organized a seven-day special winter camp at Takalgaon village from 21st to 27th January 2025.

Day One Activities Report – 21/01/2025

Inauguration Ceremony:

The NSS Annual Winter Camp for the year 2024-25 was officially inaugurated on 21st January at Takalgaon village, located in Georai Taluka, District Beed. The event marked the beginning of a week-long journey of community service, awareness activities, and student development.

The program began with traditional rituals — the hoisting of the NSS flag, lighting of the ceremonial lamp, and paying floral tribute to the portraits of Mahatma Gandhi and Sant Gadge Baba, who are revered for their ideals of cleanliness, service, and social reform.

The day started in the morning with a physical fitness and yoga session led by Dr. Tattapure, Director of Physical Education. He gave useful tips on how to stay healthy and fit. He also explained the importance of prayer during yoga and exercise. The session included boxing exercises, which the volunteers enjoyed a lot.

After breakfast, the NSS volunteers gathered on the ground for a village cleaning activity. They focused on cleaning the open gym area, which was covered with grass. The volunteers cleaned the entire space and reopened it for the villagers to use for exercise.

In the evening, there was a special session on “Dehboliche Vyaktimatva Vikasatil Yogdan” (How body language helps in personality development). This session was part of the cognitive development activities for NSS volunteers.

The guest speaker Dr.Sunita Bhosle explained how body language—like posture, eye contact, facial expressions, and hand movements affects our communication and personality. The students learned how good body language can help them become better leaders, improve confidence, and communicate clearly.

The session was interactive and the students took part with great interest. They did activities and shared their ideas. This helped them understand how to improve their body language and personality.

Day Three Activities Report – 23/01/2025

As per the schedule, the day started with morning physical activities. He suggested that we do the session in an open space or on a sports ground, so we all moved to the local school ground.

As part of the National Service Scheme (NSS) Camp, the students of the Zoology Department of our collage successfully organized a Blood Group Testing Camp. The primary objective of the camp was to create awareness about the importance of knowing one's blood group and to provide free testing for students and local residents. Under the guidance of faculty members and medical professionals, the Zoology students conducted the testing with great enthusiasm and responsibility. A total of 80 individuals participated in the camp, and their blood groups were accurately identified and recorded.

As part of the NSS Camp, a ladies' health check-up camp was organized by the Civil Hospital, Beed. The speaker for this session was Mrs. Soniya Hange, Senior Coordinator, Child Marriage Prevention Cell, Beed a well-known social activist who has helped stop many child marriages in Beed.

She shared important statistics and real-life cases and explained how harmful child marriage can be. She encouraged all the NSS volunteers to raise their voice and take action if they ever come across such situations.

The session was led by Dr. Lalita Rathod as the chairperson. Dr. G. D. Bavaskar also joined towards the end and shared valuable information with the students.

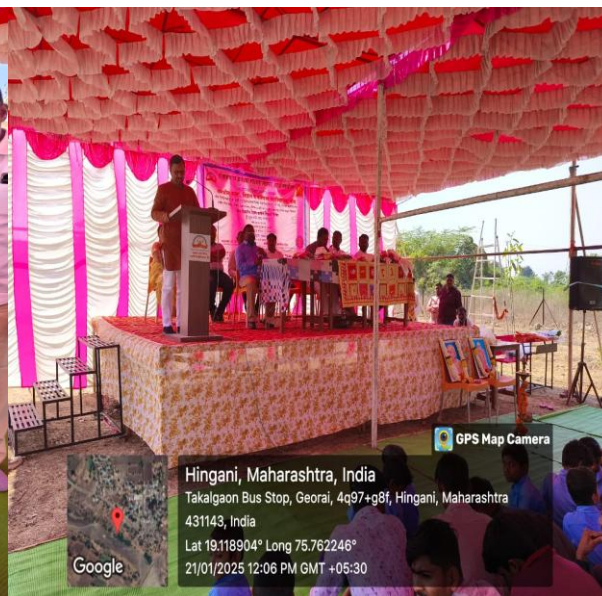
